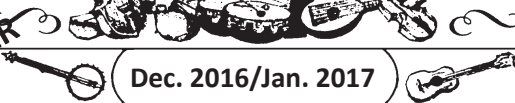

Hawaiian Music Performance/Talk: Jason Poole, Sun. Dec. 4th; 2pm

Jason Poole will present Hawaiian music from Molokai and will talk about the *Story of Sons of Hālawā* documentary. Growing up in the suburbs of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Jason never expected to find himself traveling around the country as a Hawaiian musician and cultural teacher. His life took a crazy turn following a (hip-shattering) accident; a path that led him to the island of Molokai where he was adopted into a well-respected Hawaiian family and became a master teacher of their culture, language and songs. A documentary, *Sons of Hālawā*, was made about the family and their quest to preserve this legacy. As one of the "Sons," his journey and his music are woven into the film. In this talk & performance, Jason will share his experiences writing original music for the soundtrack of the film, and what it is like to record an album on a remote island. And he will share traditional Hawaiian songs from Molokai and the neighbor islands, as well.
